- I went to a math class to meet Esperanza and help her out with the classwork; however, she had been pulled out of the class to help a new Spanish speaking student. The teacher had me stay and help out with the rest of the class.
- I then met with Esperanza for her history class, she was still working with the new student Eliana. The teacher asked us to work on the history quiz and classwork outside of the classroom.
- We did introductions and I met Eliana as well, it was her first day of school after moving from Peru and she did not speak any English.
- Then we worked on the history quiz and analyzed images of an of fortification in the slave trade. We worked together to look at the pictures and come up with questions.

difficult to balance working on the class history assignments and engaging with Eliana in
